Friday 3rd June **Sports morning** on the Recreation Ground in St Mary Bourne. Children's **cricket** and **fun tug-of-war** for all ages, shapes and sizes (see additional details).

Saturday 4th June **11am:** Sustainable Bourne Valley will have a **Plant Swap** operating at the same time.

Bike ride around the parish (see separate details - stmarybourne.org/platinum-jubilee-2022/cycle-ride-2022)

From **noon** the Village Centre will be open for a **display of jubilee & royal memorabilia and competition entries**. From 2pm **afternoon tea** will be available for the end of the bike ride and it will be possible to have an **audience with our Queen** issuing certificates as a memento of the jubilee.

From **6.30pm** the Village Centre will be open again for viewing the displays and **celebratory drinks** and nibbles.

Sunday 5th June **10.30am: Service of celebration in St Peter's** (or outside the church weather permitting).

1pm: Assemble on the Recreation Ground in St Mary Bourne for a **drone photo** (see additional details).

Big Jubilee Lunch on the Recreation Ground in St Mary Bourne. Bring food to put out on the decorated tables for all to share. Bring your own chairs & plates etc and whatever you would like to drink. We will choose our **Jubilee Queens** (see additional details on the Competitions sheet), dedicate our **jubilee tree**, and have some fun and games and dance displays.
