Trustworthiness is defined as: *deserving of trust, or able to be trusted*.

Fortunately there is one source of absolute trustworthiness that we have, and that is God. Proverbs 3 instructs "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding."

During services and in reading the Bible, we might not know the context of any written word, we might be merely repeating what has been written before; how do we know that what we read is in fact trustworthy in its meaning? Were we present for instance when the Bible was translated into English, do we know something of the character of those responsible? It is the narrator that gives the words authenticity.

The Bible has given us multiple examples of God's reliability in his promises, so I am able to fully accept and believe what I am told in biblical texts. This makes living my life so much less complicated, as I have the truth to follow and am guided by God.

We are reminded to have trust in our Lord as he is our rock, and who am I to doubt this. Poor old Thomas did not fare so well by doubting, and that is a salient lesson to remember.

I am reminded we should be regarded as: "servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy."

In order to practice being trustworthy and be regarded such, I think that demonstrating that I follow through on commitments, complete tasks to the best of my ability, keep confidences, tell the truth and anticipate the concern of others is a fairly good summary of the qualities needed in all walks of life and especially in ordained ministry.

Titus said:


"Show yourself in all respects to be a model of good works, and in your teaching show integrity, dignity. This is a trustworthy saying. And I want you to stress these things, so that those who have trusted in God may be careful to devote themselves to doing what is good. These things are excellent and profitable for everyone" (Titus 3:8).

In my former secular life, part of my job was to record witness testimonies after alleged safeguarding issues. I did not make decisions about the validity or likelihood of the situation but these interviews relied upon the 'reporter' accepting that I could be trusted with all details etc.

As ministers I fear we can be too accepting as it is the Christian ethos - to accept all / be inclusive and non-judgemental, without due concern for our own safety. Sadly in this day and age and culture this is not so easy, but if we become the judge and the jury how can our trustworthiness be guaranteed.

I often rely upon my own instincts as to whether someone is trustworthy and try to not be too quick to reject that person because they are very different to me, but the solution lies in the answer to the question 'do I believe them to be walking with God?' If the answer is yes, then I have no doubt and I hope the same will apply to me when I am under the microscope for trustworthiness.



7 - Longparish wooden bridge



With its very many river channels and streams, and the happy waterside footpaths which make Longparish such an enjoyable place to walk, such a sight is not unusual. Indeed, it really must be one of the most bridged of parishes, with an estimated eight road bridges and 29 foot-bridges these days - even more than the 27 on the OS 1894 25" map, when more people were having to walk.

The construction of most foot-bridges is simple, even if not very durable, those on registered rights-ofway now dependant on the local authority for maintenance in this time of county austerity.

But they are not to be rushed over. Better by far to linger on the bridge a while, enjoying the creaking planks, the beauty of the rippling river flow, with its dancing light and shade, and try to spot a shy trout in the clear water, or perhaps, casting off the years, play Poohsticks.



Postcard from Binley

I've written Postcard mainly from quite ordinary places. The home, the garden, on a train, or occasionally the riverbank. But today I write from the A & E department at Winchester. It's a quite simple explanation really, my puppy (nine and a half stone) is suffering from what my father used to endearingly call the "Tom Tits". And in the middle of the night when you hear the guts rumbling, and you've got to get down the stairs and to the front door before she does, you really need to be on your game. Sadly I'm not as quick across three yards of shag pile as I used to be, and I found myself upended and clattering down the elm boards and feeling every one of them. Being a chap, I assumed every rib was broken; it certainly felt like it but it turns out to be just bruising, and I was pretty much told to stop making a fuss. The only other "patients" here are a chap who has found a wart on his thumb and a mother with a child who has simply fallen and grazed her knee; so perhaps I'm not being precious after all. At one point I got a bit macho and showed the nurses my midgie bites of which I am justifiably proud. I must have dozens of them and I've never known a Hampshire summer so plagued with them. "Skin so Soft" by Avon say many but that was the old product from the 90's. The modern one doesn't touch them. All suggestions gratefully received.

So the heatwave goes on. One interesting feature, and I have been talking to an old river keeper friend of mine who runs an estate on the Avon, is the amount of mature trees that have either given up altogether or drastically have started self-pollarding themselves. Great and ancient limbs are discarded like fallow antlers, I guess to enable the main trunk to get sustenance and I have witnessed a number of these here in Binley. The heatwave has been tough on our flora and fauna. Haymaking has been ghastly and chatting with the Batchelors, they reckon it's yielding around a third of its normal tonnage. Crops likewise, and it will all impact the economy. Glum times indeed. But it's surprising how simply one's soul can be lifted, because walking up the lane yesterday around 6.30 with said puppy we encountered a very young muntjac that had got itself entangled in some wire fencing. It was screaming the house down and took a bit of extricating but we managed it, and off it scarpered in the direction of its mother who was calling from the belt of trees at the top of the downs. Put a real spring in my step. But I am worried for my Pipistrelle bats. For as long as I have lived here I have sat out at dusk in the summer months with a

small whisky (three fingers) and watched my bats that live under the eaves on the west side of the house go out to hunt. This year not one have I seen, and perhaps that alone explains the midgie epidemic here at Yew Tree? But I will be gutted if they are gone. Tiny, excruciatingly ugly, yet delightful all at the same time. I hope they return.



Remembering...

Bernard Frederick James Matthews 16th March 1941 - 1st July 2025

Bernard Frederick James Matthews was born on the 16th March 1941 to Fred and Molly Matthews at no 7 The Pit, Woodhouse, Smannell. He grew up with his cousin Laurence who lived next door. The two boys shared many adventures together during their childhood and remained close throughout their lives.

Bernard went to the local primary school at Smannell and then on to the senior Boys School in Andover. After leaving school, he did a 5-year painting and decoration apprenticeship with Dunnings. During that time, he worked all around the country on a shop-fitting contract for International Stores. After completing his apprenticeship, he worked for B and B Decorators where he became a foreman; and then for Shepherds. Those were difficult financial times for small companies in the UK and in his position as foreman Bernard unfortunately had to make a lot of local people redundant. But he is remembered by many that he worked with as a good teacher who would always give encouragement and advice. The last firm he worked for was Kings Decorators. Bernard then decided to set up on his own.

His first self-employed job was for Robin and Margaret Mackenzie at Vallev Farm and he then did some work for Mrs Crutchley in Stoke. The word spread and it went from there. Bernard worked up and down the valley until his retirement.



Bernard met his wife Catherine Kimber at The George, St Mary

Bourne in 1966 when Cath had a summer job, helping in the kitchen. They started dating, got engaged and were married in St Peter's, St Mary Bourne on 5th June 1971.

They first lived in Vigo Road, then moved in with Bernard's parents in Smannell, and from there into 1, Stoke Hollow. The only time they moved was when the old house was pulled down. They went down to Stoke Gate for 10 months until the new house in Stoke Hollow was built. They have been living there for 52 years.

James was born on 9th May 1975. Bernard was a very proud father and loved James dearly. Cath and Bernard were devoted to each other and always supported each other, as well as other members of their family. They had many shared interests and enjoyments: family holidays in the Lake District, meals out, gardening, and supporting the Saints. They were delighted when James met Ness and moved to Southampton to make a home there together.

Bernard had many years of ill health. He was a real fighter and a determined man who would never complain. He always maintained an interest in his favourite sports - football, horse racing, darts and the Tour de France – and followed and watched all the competitions on television. The possibility of returning to the beautiful Lake District for a holiday kept him going through many stays in hospital, but on the 1st July, surrounded by his family in the Countess of Brecknock hospice, Bernard passed on peacefully.

Bernard will be extremely missed by Cath, James, Ness, all the family and everyone that knew him. R.I.P.

FORTIS IBA PRESENTATION

At the July meeting, the Parish Council welcomed representatives from Fortis IBA who presented their proposal to replace and extend the existing IBA Processing Plant at the Raymond Brown A303 Enviropark. They reported that the new facilities would be enclosed within a building, reducing noise and ash pollution, while allowing greater quantities of material to be processed from across the South of England. The

building will be taller than the current plant (14.5m compared to 11.5m) but additional bunding and planting are planned to reduce visual impact. Concerns raised by residents included increased traffic, road safety, and the effect on the nearby shooting school. The planning application is scheduled for submission this month and further details will be available on the Test Valley Borough Council website.





House Martins are one of our many birds that are in decline, many years ago there must have been 50+pairs nesting now there are only 12 pairs. Last year we had 2 pairs nesting on the house in front of ours. This year 3 birds appeared on the 24th of April and started visiting the old nests. But on the Sunday Mr House Sparrow appeared and decided he would like to



take over their nest. He sat on the roof feathers all puffed up chirping away hoping to attract a female there were a couple of females came and had a look but didn't

stay long. He sat up there all week chirping away and he would chase the House Martins off if they came anywhere near their nests. We went away on holiday for a week on the 1st May and thought no more House Martins. We arrived home on the 7th May and no Mr House Sparrow! The House Martins are back, but sadly still only three. Then mid-week the pair chased the single one away obviously he never found a mate, so at least we had one pair. I don't know when they laid their eggs, but they were busy feeding young on the 1st of June, they didn't fledge until the mid-July which is a long time as they usually fledge in 21-28 days. Now my theory is a lack of insects.



One of their foods are Aphids and I have not seen any this year. Still the good news is they fledge 3 young and they are sitting on eggs again.





The Miracle of the fishes and the loaves by Hardman & Co. of Birmingham has taken a severe impact hole to the damask robe in the lower central light.


The window in the belfry of Christ raising Lazarus by Lavers and Barraud is suffering the deterioration known as Green Glass Disease.

Joanna, David, Humphrey Roebuck, and Patrick with Peter Hull are involved in the Hampshire and Isle of




needed for this project. You are most welcome to donate for this or directly to the Church, please consider Gift Aid.
